Summary

Assignment 1:	Review of the Matrix of PWRA
Consensus:	<p>Members of the two panels are still completing the revision and matrix of PwRA, started by Tony Koop, with examples of PwRA from different parts of the world. Several questions that need to be addressed during the meeting in Raleigh arose:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Need to identify the differences between a PwRA and a PRA (Gaps and overlaps with ISPM11) - How will a PwRA differ from a commodity analysis - What is the added value of a PwRA standard - Need of a consensus on what is PwRA <p>It was agreed that members will send their revisions to the chair of AIS to complete the matrix.</p>
Assignment 2:	Identification of possible participants in the Symposia on PWRA
Consensus:	While waiting for the information on possible speakers that will be provided by the Matrix, several participants and themes were identified by the group such as Phillip Hulme, the work of PRATIQUE in Europe and the possibility of looking into the work done for aquatic/marine organism pathways.
Assignment 3:	Agreement on date and location of the next Panel meeting (suggested Raleigh NC, on the 10-14 of May, 2010)

Consensus:	The next PRA and AIS panel meetings and the Pathways symposium will be held in Raleigh, North Carolina, during the week of the 10th to the 14th of May, 2010.
