Consensus:	 Export electronic system is up and running. Only issuing pre-sale certificates. Will be able to issue phytosanitary certificates in the fall of 2019. Successful text message to the hub using the centralize government system. Mexico: Our message mapping is complete and have established our connection in the hub; we have been working with Argentina and US to confirm that our format is valid. Pending: ongoing development to automate the sending and receiving. Will continue to work on certificates through the hub, but not an automatic system. US: Webinar demo with Canada after chairperson return from CPM. Actively exchanging with Argentina, Chile, New Zealand and the Netherlands. Actively working to help Korea and Peru.
