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
Eradication vs Suppression

- Biology:

 - What tools

- Economics:
 - Cost of the program
 - Value of the crop/natural resource



Emerald Ash Borer





Host trees

- EAB All 16 species of ash (*Fraxinus* spp.)
- Uses: Ornamental, forest, commercial
 - Tool handles, baseball bats, housing





Economic Damage

- Tourism
- Industry
 - Timber
 - Nursery
 - Bats, Furniture
 - Baskets
- Suburban Trees
- Nursery stock industry
- Water Quality
- Air Quality










Timeline Of EAB Program





Suppression: Outreach & Biocontrol





- Develop success biocontrol agents
- Distribute to affected areas
- EAB.Biocontrol.Program@usda.gov.

- Focused on reporting the insect and tree damage to recognize the movement
- Don't move firewood to limit the natural spread









EAB Proposed Rule

- Remove domestic quarantine
- Comment period ended November 19, 2018
- Proposed rule and comments: Federal eRulemaking Portal
- Status after rule: non-quarantine, but actionable @ ports
