<p>Symposium - The impacts of climate change on plant health</p> <p><i>The assessment and management of climate change impacts on plant health is one of the 8 development agenda on the IPPC 2020-2030 Strategic Framework.</i></p> <p><i>The mitigation of climate-change related impacts on agriculture and plant health will present a major challenge to National plant protection organizations (NPPOs) and international organizations in the plant health field. Changes in food production patterns and trade will become apparent over the next decades. The resulting changes in plant health, such as anomalies in pest epidemiology and frequent expansion of pest distributions, will provide challenges, especially in the areas of surveillance, monitoring, and pest risk analysis. The danger of pests adapting to changed climate parameters may cause new pest risk to major staple crops.</i></p> <p><i>The topic for this year’s symposium during the NAPPO annual meeting will be on the impacts of climate change on plant health, including the related realities and needs. This will be an opportunity for governments and industry in North America to discuss:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>What impacts are we seeing now and has this changed our expectations for the impacts on plant health, what are the current related plans and policies relating to adaptation?</i> • <i>Threats and opportunities: new pests (extended host range) and new cropping options and possible new related pests.</i> • <i>What should we be doing in plant health legislative control and multilaterally?</i>
