	<ul> <li>NAPPO TD inquired about the data from traps provided to AGM regulated countries. EG members do not have any information yet but are expecting to get some information at the end of the official flight season</li> <li>Canada:         <ul> <li>End or high-risk period in Canada is September 15.</li> <li>Most vessels arriving were certified free of AGM</li> <li>Small number of vessels with AGM have been reported arriving to Canada.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Seneral updates         <ul> <li>New Zealand AGM program is up and running and ready to start their 2018 season. The NZ AGM program used the NAPPO RSPM33 standard as a reference.</li> <li>The Chairperson informed the group about an upcoming APHIS/CFIA trip to Chile on September 11 and 12to meet with the COSAVE Forestry working group to discuss invasive species issues,including AGM.</li> <li>Mexico expressed interest in knowing the results from the implementation of COSAVE members' AGM regulations.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>		
Item 2/ Asunto 2:	Ongoing work and new opportunities. The Chairperson shared a document with recommendations from the 2015 AGM workshop in Kemah, Texas and asked the group for feedback on those recommendations that would enhance the NAPPO EG AGM work.		
Consensus/Decisiones:	<ul> <li>Continue to provide support to Mexico in the development and implementation of their AGM program.</li> <li>Holding a workshop with the four AGM-regulated countries for exchanges similar to those at the Houston workshop. It was suggested that it might be good to broaden participation to regulating and regulated countries. There was discussion around how best to to disseminate and distribute information of benefit to all parties involved in the AGM program (including organizations like shippers, vessel owners and shipping lines - among others.</li> <li>Considerations to have another AGM workshop in one or two years. This timing will allow Mexico to implement their national AGM regulations and share their experiences at the workshop.</li> <li>Challenges for getting certification and procedures for ordering vessels out of ports upon arrival to North America will be two important topics to address in a workshop. Consider updates to RSPM 33 in the near future to provide information that should be included in the pre-departure certificates (i.e. examples in an appendix to RSPM 33). Another update that could be considered for RSPM 33 is to include types of information on non-</li> </ul>		

	compliant vessels to share with to those countries where the non-compliance vessels originated in order to facilitate follow-ups.  • Develop training module via online platforms or mobile apps.
	Mexico inquired about the next steps regarding an AGM workshop. The NAPPO TD indicated that it should be submitted as a new project proposal but not for this year because the deadline to submit proposal already passed. If submitted as a project proposal it should be done in 2018 to implement in the 2019 season.
